Empowering Leaders: A Three-Day Leadership Training Workshop

The three-day Leadership Training Workshop at Manchester International School, led by Mr. Praveen Vyas and Ms. Shrusti Mahajan from Live Life Education, provided a valuable opportunity for educators to enhance their leadership skills. Day 1 introduced the Leader In Me program, focusing on the See-Do-Get model and paradigms of leadership, while also covering the first three habits from Dr. Stephen R. Covey's The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People. Teachers enaaaed in reflective activities, including writing gratitude letters, and gained insights into proactive thinking, vision setting, effective and prioritization.





On Day 2, the session started with an activity called Bless, Connect, and teachers expressed Express, where appreciation and apologies to their peers. The focus shifted to Habit 3: Put First Things First, emphasizing trust in relationships through the concept of an Emotional Bank Account. Habit 4: Think Win-Win encouraged educators to foster mutually beneficial agreements, demonstrated through a fun balloon and toothpick game. Habit 5: Seek First to Understand, Then to Be Understood highlighted the importance of empathic listening, making the session both interactive and insightful.

Day 3 focused on Habit 6: Synergize, which emphasized valuing differences and promoting creative cooperation, followed by Habit 7: Sharpen the Saw, which underscored the need for continuous renewal of the body, heart, mind, and spirit. Teachers participated in activities such as story-making and the Destination Game to apply the habits in real-life scenarios. The workshop concluded with a motivating rendition of Michael Jackson's "Heal the World," inspiring the educators to lead with purpose and compassion. This enriching workshop empowered educators with essential leadership tools, equipping them to foster growth, collaboration, and success within their classrooms and beyond.
